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Privacy Notice for Trustees of Headway Devon

Who is collecting your personal data?

Headway Devon collects the personal data of Trustees. We will ensure that the data give us is processed in line with our organisation's Data Protection Policies and in line with your rights under the Data Protection Act 2017 and the EU General Data Protection Regulations. Why are we collecting your personal data?

As a Trustee of Headway Devon we need to hold your personal data on our data base such as your name, address, email address, telephone number, DBS results and next of kin. It is your responsibility to inform us when information changes. This information is used either for contacting you as part of our day to day operational needs, for emergency contact purposes and to comply with the requirements of the Charity Commission and Company House. In addition, we record details of meetings, a register of significant influence, checks on your legal ability to be a Trustee and any expenses.

Our legal basis for holding your information

It is necessary for Headway Devon to hold this information because it is in our legitimate interests and there is a legal requirement to do so.

How we store your information

This information is held in our database and information is backed up to the cloud. Electronic information is also stored on a secure server in our central office. In addition to our electronic records, we also hold manual records in a Trustee folder at our central office. These files contain a manual record of the above and are for the convenience of our staff should we be unable to access the database in instances such a power cut or internet connection problems etc.

Who we will share your personal data with?

In order to satisfy the our legal obligations as a charity it will be necessary for us to share your personal data with other organisations. These include, the Charities Commission, the charity's appointed firm of accountants, Companies House and the DBS agency should we need to check your DBS record. Your email address will also be shared with other trustees (e.g. copied (cc:ed) in to email correspondence). This is to ensure that Trustees are able to contact one another without consulting the staff team, should the need arise. We share your information with software providers but ensure through strict data sharing agreements that they are responsible and legally compliant with your data.

We would never sell your data to any third parties.

How long will we hold your personal data?

The fact that you have been a Trustee will be held permanently in our records and on Company House and the Charity Commission websites. We will also maintain contact details and records of meetings that you attended. Further personal information will be maintained for seven years before destroying securely.

Your rights

You have the right to apply to us for a copy of the personal data being held and after we have confirmed your identity, we have up to one calendar month to get this information to you. We have the right to make a 'reasonable' charge for requests that are manifestly unfounded, excessive or repetitive.

You also have the right to instruct us to amend information that is incorrect and we must act within one month.

You have the right to request we erase your data and then we will investigate whether we can do so legally. If we are unable to do so we will inform you or we will erase your data within one month. You have the right to ask us not to use your data. If we are unable to do so we will inform you.

You have the right to complain about the data that we hold and the way we hold and use that data.

Your right to complain

In the event that you wish to complain about the way that your personal data has been handled by Headway Devon, you should write to the Data Protection Lead and clearly outline your case. Ruth Wells, Data Protection Lead, The X Centre, Commercial Road, Exeter. EX2 4AD. Your complaint will then be investigated in accordance with our Complaints Procedure. Photography and Videos Consent Form

There will be instances at Headway Devon when photographs and video footage will be taken of Trustees and sometimes film or videos made by the Press or television companies. Some of these images will be used for teaching, publicity and fundraising purposes and some may be uploaded onto "YouTube".

It is often quite likely that clients, staff and volunteers will also appear in those photographs or films, as will others who are not the intended subject.

It is important that we are able to protect your anonymity if you so wish, but equally important that we have your agreement to the publication / release of pictures or film if you should appear in them. Therefore we ask that you signify below your approval for the publication of such items if you are content to do so or alternatively to indicate your wish not to have them published.

We have to have your permission to take photographs or videos and you have the right to change your mind at any time. We will then make every effort to destroy anything that we have taken although if items have been published externally we may not be in control.

As a result, I would like to ask you to confirm that you agree for us to use and hold photographic and video images of you.
